The Skills and Achievement Commencement Credential which is awarded to students that have taken the NYS Alternate Assessment (NYSAA) will also be reviewed.

Ending the Silence is a FREE early intervention prevention mental health presentation for students in Ulster County High Schools. Why does Ending the Silence matter?

1 in 5 children experience a mental health condition; only 20% of youth actually get help.

Suicide is the second-leading cause of death for 15-24 year olds.

About 50% of students age 14+ with a mental health condition will drop out of school.

Stigma is the greatest barrier to individuals receiving treatment and achieving recovery.

Early identification and intervention provides better outcomes!

Students learn about the signs and symptoms of mental illness, recovery and coping strategies, how to help friends, how to reduce stigma and other important topics that can help spread awareness and knowledge of mental illness.
